



The Tomb Is Empty and He is Alive!

We definitely have a lot going on in April and it's an exciting time! Spring is here and we are all looking forward to better weather. Vacation times are in their planning stages.

The first day of April we think about is April 1, which is called April Fools' Day. That's a time when people play tricks or jokes



on others and try to fool them. It's something that our not-so-welcome friend, Satan, likes to do to us a lot of times during the year! He'll try to put us in certain situations or whisper things to us that make us wonder if this is God talking to us. Yes, sometimes it's difficult to tell the difference between the words and actions of God and of Satan. Satan might put us in good situations just to flip them over and create difficult issues for us. He will try and cloud our thinking and move us away from our faith. We can take comfort in what Jesus tells us in Scripture. In John 10:27, he says, "My sheep listen to my voice; I know them, and they follow me." What Jesus is telling us is that we will know His voice. We can hear Him, and if we're deep in his Word, deep in worship, and deep in glorifying Him, not just on Sundays, but every day, it becomes easier to tell if we're being tempted by Satan or it's Jesus calling us.


On April 13th this year, we celebrate Palm Sunday, which is known as Jesus' triumphant ride into Jerusalem as He headed towards the cross. It's also a day that we here at Church of the Brethen will baptize believers in the name of the Father, the name of the Son, and the name of the Holy Spirit. What an exciting day to have other brothers and sisters witness their faith in Christ and join us in serving God!

The Son Rise Service on Easter Sunday is at 7 AM out on the front lawn as long as it's not raining. That's the time we come to the tomb, expecting it to be empty. The women came that Sunday morning after the crucifixion, expecting to anoint Jesus' dead body with oil. What they found, though, was that Jesus was not there. Can you even imagine what they might have been feeling? They must have been devastated from watching Jesus be beaten and crucified on a cross--that terrible scene that took place on what we call Good Friday. They grieved over the loss of their loved one all that Friday night, all day Saturday, and Sunday morning, never occurring to them that He was alive. It is sad to say that many people today do not believe that Jesus is alive. They believe that someone stole the body, that He never resurrected from that tomb. They want some sort of evidence that He is alive. We can't give them medical records and we don't have any pictures from that day. All we have is the words in the Bible from the four Gospels: Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John, the testimonies of those who witnessed Jesus' life, His death, and His resurrection.

Besides the whole Bible, where you can find Jesus from the beginning to the end, we have our very own stories and testimonies of what Jesus has done for each of us. If you are a Christian you will have a testimony of Jesus in your life. It's up to us to spread the good news of Jesus Christ. What can we do so that others, too, can believe that Jesus is alive? We have no physical proof from that day, but we can tell others and show them we walk by faith not by sight. And for those of you out there that have been on the other side, where maybe you didn't believe in Jesus, and now you do, that's a heck of a story that needs to be told!

SPOTLIGHT ON THE OUTREACH TEAM
